El nombre completo A person's full name (nombre completo) consists of a first name (nombre), which often consists of two names, plus two surnames—the father's family name (apellido paterno), followed by the mother's family name (apellido materno).

For example, look at the nombres completos of María Teresa's parents:

> Felipe Rivera López y Guadalupe Treviño Ibarra

- What is Felipe's apellido paterno?
- · What is Guadalupe's apellido materno?
- Can you explain how María Teresa's name is formed?

María Teresa will most often use her first name and her father's family name. If she marries, she may add de and her husband's last name to her own name: María Teresa Rivera de García.
