**Práctica: Direct Object Pronouns
(Example on back!)**

You and your nutritionist are reviewing the list of food that you ate yesterday. If an item is on the list below, it means you ate it. If the item is not on the list, it means you did not eat it. Answer the questions below using the appropriate direct object pronoun (**lo, la, los, las**). Follow the model.

Zanahorias	Cebollas	Guisantes	Judías verdes
Ensalada	Pollo	Fresas	Naranja
Lechuga	Pescado	Plátanos	Tomate

MODELO: ¿Comiste manzanas? (las)
Sí, las comí / No, no las comí.

1. ¿Comiste helado ayer?

2. ¿Comiste cebollas?

3. ¿Comiste pasteles?

4. ¿Comiste ensalada?

5. ¿Comiste tomate?

6. ¿Comiste perritos calientes?

Direct Object Pronoun Practice Model

Zanahorias	Cebollas	Guisantes	Judías verdes
Ensalada	Pollo	Fresas	Naranja
Lechuga	Pescado	Plátanos	Tomate

Step 1: Underline the object receiving the direct action of the verb in the question.

1. ¿Comiste manzanas?

Step 2: Choose a direct object pronoun (lo, la, los, las) to replace the underlined word in the question. Then, put the direct object pronoun you chose in parentheses next to the question.

1. ¿Comiste manzanas? (*las*)

(I chose "las" as the direct object pronoun because the word "manzanas" is feminine and plural.)

Step 3: Check the list to see if the food in the question was eaten or not.

I do not see "manzanas" on the list of food I ate yesterday, so *I did not eat apples.*

Step 4: Answer the question using the direct object pronoun you chose in Step 2.

1. ¿Comiste manzanas? (*las*)

No, no las comí.

REMEMBER: Direct object pronouns go directly in front of the conjugated verb or on the end of an infinitive!
